#### Tell us about your role, where you work and how long you have been in post

I currently work at Moorfields Eye Centre at Bedford Hospital as a Theatre Assistant. I have been in post for just over two years.

#### What qualifications and experience did you have prior to coming into the role?

I took my GCSE exams and then obtained a certificate in health and social care at my local college. I then joined Bedford Hospital as an X-ray porter before progressing to become a Health Care Assistant on an orthopaedic ward. From there I was offered the opportunity to work in theatres as a Theatre Assistant. I started as a band 2 and have progressed to become a band 3.

#### Describe a typical working day and how you make a difference

My day involves making sure that theatre is in working order for the upcoming day list. I undertake daily checks on equipment being used to ensure that it works as it should. I unload the instruments bin which contain the sterile clean instruments needed for the list ahead. I assist with bringing the patients into the operating theatre and talk with them to ensure they stay calm during the procedure and I answer any questions they might have. I assist with completing the World Health Organisation surgical safety checklist with the rest of the team and I help to get the required instruments ready for the scrub nurse and surgeon. After the procedure I accompany the patient to the reception area so that my colleagues can take their blood pressure. I make the patient a cup of tea or coffee and go through the aftercare eye treatment with them.

### Tell us about the training, education and career opportunities you have

I recently completed the new ophthalmology course and instilling eye drops course at Moorfields. I am working between my theatre role and undertaking training in my clinical area.
