
Black History Month 2020: Making a Difference Awards

Celebrating black, Asian and minority ethnic contribution to health and social care.

As part of our Black History Month 2020 celebrations, the Royal College of Nursing South East Region invites you to nominate an individual who has made a real difference in the delivery of healthcare. The individual you nominate must be from the black, Asian and minority ethnic nursing community, or have made a real difference on behalf of the Black, Asian and minority ethnic nursing community.

The *Making A Difference Awards* are an opportunity to recognise and reward nurses, nursing support workers and midwives. We welcome nominations from within and outside the NHS, including agency workers who work in the South East Region.

The theme of this year's celebrations is *Our Voice, Our Power, Our Presence* so if you're nominating a colleague, please have a think about how their achievement fits into one of these categories or just tell us why they're amazing! We've provided some ideas of what this could include in the application form below, however we'd really like you to remember that even the smallest of acts can make a massive difference to patients, services and to our colleagues.

How to nominate a candidate

Nominate someone who works in the South East Region who:

- is from a black, Asian and minority ethnic background, and/or may work with black, Asian and minority ethnic communities but this is not essential
- promotes black, Asian and minority ethnic communities in the course of their work
- works in a nursing role across bands 2-7, or role equivalent
- is key to the future of nursing (locally and/or nationally)
- is a member of the RCN.

Please submit your nominations by Monday 24 August 2020.

Due to the current challenges around COVID-19 there will not be a physical award ceremony this year. Instead, the recipients of the 2020 awards will receive a prize and will be unveiled at a live event where their contribution will be formally recognised. Their contribution will also be publicised across RCN South East Region social media channels during Black History Month.
